NOVEMBER 21 JOHANNESBURG

On arrival in Johannesburg you will be met and transferred to Da Vinci Hotel and Suites for overnight the next two nights in a standard room.

NOVEMBER 22 JOHANNESBURG (BL)

Breakfast at the hotel. Full day Constitution Hill and Soweto tour.

Today you will be taken on a tour of Constitution Hill – Court and Old Fort Prison. Continue to Kliptown open air museum and Soweto. You know the name. It's a legend. SOWETO, acronym for South Western Township, is home to over 2 million people, who, despite living in crowded and chaotic conditions, have a tangible sense of community, one which ironically, the ordered, walled, elitist northern suburbs lack.

Inside Soweto, you will visit the Hector Pieterse Museum and discover the cause of the tragic riots which led to his death. Photo stop at Mandela House (entrance optional and own account). Your journey continues to Regina Mundi Church, site of many secret underground meetings of the then banned political parties. Soweto is unlike a suburb you've ever seen or been to, yet the history of struggle encapsulated here is a cornerstone of the South African story.

Lunch is included at Sakhumzi's restaurant. Return to your hotel for overnight.

NOVEMBER 23 KRUGER PARK/KAPAMA GAME RESERVE (BLD)

Breakfast at the hotel and transfer to Johannesburg airport in time for your flight to Hoedspruit (flight not included) On arrival you will transfer to Kapama Private Game Reserve. If there is time you will have an afternoon activity. Included is all meals, teas and snacks, all local and select premium drinks, two daily safari activities, bush walks, conservation levies. Overnight the next two nights at Kapama River Lodge in a deluxe suite.

Kapama Private Game Reserve, with its portfolio of luxury game lodges, occupies a vast area between South Africa's northern Drakensberg mountains and the Greater Kruger National Park. Adjacent to Kapama, Hoedspruit's Eastgate Airport is ideally located to receive guests flying to Kapama on scheduled flights from

both Johannesburg and Cape Town, and on private charters. Kapama offers courtesy transfers in open game viewing vehicles from Eastgate Airport to our four luxurious safari lodges: River Lodge, Buffalo Camp, Kapama Karula and Southern Camp.

Situated in South Africa's northernmost province of Limpopo, renowned for its prolific and diverse wildlife, Kapama Private Game Reserve is home to over 40 different mammal species, including the most dangerous Big Five of elephant, lion, leopard, buffalo and rhinoceros. Approximately 350 bird species and a myriad smaller species can also be seen here in their natural environment. Twice-daily game drives through the reserve, accompanied by expert guides and trackers, ensure unforgettable wildlife encounters in the African bush.

Within the expansive Kapama Private Game Reserve, River Lodge epitomises five-star safari accommodation. The majestic northern Drakensberg mountains form the backdrop to the 64-suite River Lodge, which is positioned along a bend of the seasonal Kapama River. It's the largest luxury game lodge in the Greater Kruger National Park area, and is stylishly furnished to ensure an unforgettable African safari experience.

River Lodge's 40 spacious air-conditioned suites have uninterrupted views over the Big Five game reserve from private patios, and all feature full, en-suite bathrooms with lavish amenities replenished daily. The suites are decorated to reflect old Africa in a luxury game lodge setting. Beverage stations for early morning coffee in suite and minibars for sundowners on your private patio are standard in all rooms.

NOVEMBER 24 KRUGER PARK/KAPAMA GAME RESERVE (BLD)

Full day of game viewing activities with all meals and overnight at Kapama River Lodge in a deluxe suite.

NOVEMBER 25 ARRIVE IN CAPE TOWN (B)

Breakfast at the lodge. If there is time you will have a morning game activity. Transfer to Hoedspruit airport in time for your flight to Cape Town (flight not included). On arrival at Cape Town airport you will be met and transferred to the Table Bay Hotel for overnight the next 5 nights in a luxury room.

With its majestic Table Mountain backdrop, Cape Town is one of the most beautiful and exciting cities in the world; an eclectic mix of architectural styles reflects the tastes and dictates of the past and the more functional demands of the 20th Century. Cobblestone streets, mosques and the flat roofed pastel homes of the Malay quarter enhance a cosmopolitan ambience and in a recent development, the restoration of the Victoria and Alfred Waterfront evokes images of the seafaring activities of the 19th century. At the end of the day, gourmets and lovers of sophisticated entertainment have a treat in store as the choice for your evening's repast is vast.

NOVEMBER 26 CAPE TOWN (B)

Breakfast at the hotel. This morning transfer to the Table Mountain cableway for a wonderful view of the city. The Table Mountain ticket is included (weather dependent). The afternoon is at your leisure.

NOVEMBER 27 CAPE TOWN (B)

Breakfast at the hotel and the day is at leisure.

NOVEMBER 28 CAPE TOWN B)

Breakfast at the hotel. Full day Robben Island and District Six Museum Tour.

This morning walk to the ferry terminal with a guide. Your Robben Island tour will start at 9:00am (weather dependent). The standard tour to Robben Island is 3.5 hours long, including the two half-hour ferry rides.

Please note that Robben Island has implemented a new procedure for all passengers booked on the Robben Island tour. Guests are required to show proof of passport/ ID and fill out an indemnity form before boarding the vessel to Robben Island. They may bring copies of Identification should they wish to rather keep the original at the hotel.

From the 17th to the 20th centuries, Robben Island served as a place of banishment, isolation and imprisonment. Today it is a World Heritage Site and museum, a poignant reminder to the newly democratic South Africa of the price paid for freedom. It is important for all visitors to experience all phases of the Island, to realize that the Island is a place of pain and a place of triumph and victory. The island tour discusses these themes as well as the detention and isolation of insane females, people with leprosy and prisoners, including African chiefs in the 1800's. The Prison tour depicts the lives of political prisoners detained from the 1960's to 1991. Former Robben Island prisoners conduct the tour.

The Robben Island Tour includes: A return boat trip across Table Bay, a visit to the infamous Maximum Security Prison, interaction with an ex-political prisoner, a 45-minute bus ride with a guide providing commentary, the opportunity to explore the Murray's Bay Harbour precinct attractions, such as the Muslim shrine, or kramat, and the Museum Shop.

Return to the Waterfront for lunch own account. After lunch visit District Six Museum.

As a result of the Group Areas Act, 60 000 Capetonian families were forcibly removed from this once vibrant area between 1966 and 1982. The District Six issue remains crucial. You will examine the now desolate area, Zonnebloem, which was District Six and visit the living museum which attempts to represent and recapture District Six in various ways - as a finespun tapestry of communal life torn apart but not forgotten.

Return to your hotel.

NOVEMBER 29 CAPE TOWN (B)

Breakfast at the hotel and the day is at leisure.

OPTIONAL HALF DAY WINELANDS TOUR

What is the best feature of the Cape Winelands? It's true that it is renowned for its crisp white and classic French-style red wines, but it also has a stunning wealth of natural rustic beauty with vast estates shaded from the African sunshine by giant oak trees and towering mountains overlooking lush valleys. On this half day tour we will have a cellar tour and wine tasting at a wine estate, and a wine tasting at a second estate. Enjoy a Stellenbosch orientation tour and return to Cape Town.

OPTIONAL FULL DAY PENINSULA TOUR

Breakfast at the hotel and head out for a full day Peninsula tour. Embark on a spectacular journey around the Cape Peninsula taking in all the highlights and breath-taking beauty of this world-renowned Cape. Travel through historic suburbs, charming fishing villages and awesome viewpoints on your way to Cape Point, where the mighty Atlantic and Indian Oceans meet. The tour begins with a scenic drive along the Atlantic coast which is home to some of the most expensive real estate in the country. Pass through the fishing village of Hout Bay. Here you will take a cruise to Seal Island to see the large colonies of Cape Fur Seals sunning themselves on the island's rocky outcrops.

The tour then heads along Chapman's Peak Drive. With a towering mountain above it and a sheer drop below, this part of the road is renowned for its spectacular 180° views of the Cape Peninsula making it a favoured spot for photographers. Our journey now reaches the tip of the Cape Peninsula, a dramatic view point located

in an 17,750 hectare nature reserve. Looking out over the shining sea from the Cape Point Lighthouse truly makes you feel like you are standing at the edge of the world. Funicular ticket is included. After a stop for lunch at Bertha's Restaurant in Simons Town, you will head to Boulders Beach where you can sit among a colony of African penguins. Return to your hotel in the late afternoon and spend the evening at leisure.

NOVEMBER 30 DEPART (B)

Breakfast at the hotel and transfer to Cape Town airport in time for your flight home. Normal check out times apply.

NOTE! For ALL TRAVELERS flying to (including returning to) the USA - Effective Dec 2021, until further notice

All passengers over 2 years must present a negative COVID-19 viral test result, or proof of recovery from COVID in the past 90 days, to the airline prior to boarding USA bound flights, or boarding will be denied. This is regardless of vaccination status. **Currently, the test must be taken no more than 1 day before the flight to the USA.** These requirements may change at any time. Passengers may still have to complete any mandated quarantine requirements, if applicable. Locating and accessing COVID testing sites in destination, and paying the costs for COVID tests are the full responsibility of the traveler. These costs can be up to \$300, as a guideline.

COVID-19 is causing constant & ongoing changes in the application of the above types of measures. The way a country, government, airline or airport chooses to deal with the threat of COVID is constantly changing.

It is your responsibility to keep yourself and members of your traveling party (travel companions) informed of, and meet, all requirements in relation to your trip and any COVID based restrictions, and we suggest these are constantly monitored until your trip is complete, as they can change at any time even while travelling overseas.
